Procedural Justice

Fairness of the decision-making process

Things to ask

- When and how is community input being solicited and implemented?
- Is this a transparent process? Is it community led?
- How are projects being chosen? How is the problem being defined?








Heat Relief 4 LA Campaign 2024-25

Bus Shelters

AVOID HEAT STROKE

HEAT EXHAUSTION: Faint or dizzy, Excessive sweating, Cool pale or clammy skin, Nausea or vomiting, Rapid, weak pulse, Muscle cramps.

HEAT STROKE: Headache, No sweating, Body temperature above 103°F or 39°C, Nausea or vomiting, Rapid, strong pulse, Unconsciousness.

Extreme Heat is the Climate Hazard resulting in the greatest harm & excess health burdens


